His last assignment was with the US Central Command (USCENTCOM) where he was on the General Staff for General H. Norman Schwarzkopf, Commander of all the coalition forces for the "Operation Desert Storm" Gulf War. He retired from the military in June '94. He subsequently had employment with the State Of Florida Attorney General's Office, and the Progressive and Mercury Insurance companies as a Senior Medical Fraud Investigator. He formally retired in February '09. Mike ultimately settled in The Villages in 2005 where he lived in the Village of Mallory Square.










CORVETTE KEY FOB BATTERY TIP

As we are reminded to change the batteries in our household smoke detectors once a year, you may want to consider changing the battery in your Corvette Key FOB before it fails. Some recommend changing the battery in your Key FOB every year. Most use a round Quarter size battery (CR2450 for a C5 and CR 2032 for C6 and C7). It's also a good idea to keep an extra one in the glove Box.
