Back in early April, several members of the Village Vettes attended a wine making class at the Corkscrew Winery in Spanish Springs. We got to participate in and learn about each step of the wine making process. In June, we returned to the winery to fill our bottles and label them. The group had the opportunity to share the ambiance at The Corkscrew Winery and to sample some

of their delicious wines. Now here we are like horses at the gate ready to go and consume our own wine..

As it turned out, we had two extra bottles of Cuvee Blanc White wine. We collectively decided to share them with our club membership and brought them to our June meeting to be offered up to members as 50/50 drawing door prizes. Bob Kerfin and Dave Taylor were the lucky winners. Just remember...it is not what vintage or year the wine was made but what month!













Crevalle Boat Factory Tour Don Chaney, Event Leader





On Monday, June 11th, twenty members of the Village Vettes met at the Eisenhower Rec Center and ventured over to Crevalle Boats in Wildwood for a factory tour. We were directed to their large conference and met with Crevalle's President Nick Engels and Plant Manager Mike Haskins. Nick Engels is one of 5 people in the U.S. that has a Marine Engineering Degree and a Nautical Engineering Degree. I think he knows a little about water craft.

Due to the number of our members participating, we were split into two groups to begin our tour.

Their facility consisted of two buildings, one for the casting of each fiberglass hull and miscellaneous deck components and the other for final assembly. One of the first questions we asked was, how did they come up with the name Crevalle. Nick preceded to tell us that most boat manufacturers named their boats after fish. As he was discussing this with his wife, she asked what kind of fish was it that kicked his butt the last time they went on a fishing trip. Nick recalled that is was a "Jack Crevalle", the Rodney Dangerfield of gamefish. It is a very strong fish for its size that attacks its prey (or lure) aggressively.





Crevalle builds two classes of walk around center console boats, 24 and 26 feet in length. Each is equipped with an outboard motor. I gathered that Mercury engines were preferred. Crevalle uses state of the art numerical control computer systems to nest parts on a single sheet to minimize waste and laser cutting with Kerf compensation to insure the correct size of the finished parts. When asked why the tip of the bow design dipped down rather than up it was explained that Crevalle boats are designed to immediately come up on plain to prevent the bow from rising high then settling down. If you have ever owned a small water craft you will know exactly what this means and how it is truly a clever design.

In 2017, Crevalle Boats was named the Manufacturers Association of Florida Small Manufacturer of the Year. Crevalle has less than 30 employees and programs to support the beginners in the fiberglass boat building trade.

Following our tour, we drove up to Habanero's Mexican Restaurant in Southern Trace Shopping Center for lunch.

NCM 25th Anniversary Celebration/6th Annual National Corvette Caravan

Often referred to as the world's largest moving automotive event, the National Corvette Caravan is a celebration of America's Sports Car, culminating in Bowling Green, Kentucky for the 25th Anniversary Celebration of the National Corvette Museum (NCM). What started out in 1994 as an impromptu gathering of museum enthusiasts has grown into a five-year anniversary

tradition drawing thousands of participants from all over the world to celebrate the Corvette lifestyle.

Regional caravans are forming NOW and readying plans to join other caravans as they travel across the United States to converge on Bowling Green, Kentucky, for four-days of festivities at the NCM (August 28 – 31, 2019).

You are reminded, while 2019 may seem like a long way off, the key to success for a fun/carefree event of this magnitude necessitates an early commitment for attendance. It is requested members take notice of this event and commence the thought process for a decision as to whether there is an interest to attend the event. Briefly, the initial scheduling has been detailed as follows:

The Florida Caravan will commence in Daytona, Florida on Sunday, August 25, 2019 through the following Monday.

- The Florida Caravan will depart Daytona on Tuesday, August 27th for Acworth, GA remain overnight in Acworth, GA stage early with the Georgia Caravan on Wednesday, August 28th, then depart/arrive Bowling Green on the same day for a planned NCM arrival between 01:00 PM 02:00 PM.
- The Village Vettes travel group will <u>NOT</u> join the Daytona festivities. We will "hook up" with the Caravan as they trek Northward on Tuesday, August 27th. If you desire to participate in the Daytona activities (Sunday, August 25th through Monday, August 26th), you will need to coordinate this activity.
- The NCM Anniversary Celebration is Wednesday, August 28th through Saturday, August 31st. Following the events on Saturday, members can depart at their leisure for home or other personal plans.

On the matter of hotel reservations, Florida Caravan Captain, Sue Militelo, has advised earlier block reservation have been expended. Efforts are underway to coordinate additional reservations. Information will be posted by Mike as it becomes available.

It has been advised pre-registration for the 2019 Caravan/Anniversary event tickets will open this coming September 2018. You will obtain your tickets via the Corvette Museum web site. (www.corvettemuseum.org) Pre-registration pricing for 25th NCM Anniversary Celebration 2019 is: Lifetime Member - \$25.00/person; Museum Member - \$35.00/person; Non-Member - \$45.00/person. Associated pricing for the separate Caravan registration has yet to be announced by the NCM. You will need to register both yourself AND spouse/guest for the 2019 Caravan AND event tickets. Mike will provide further guidance/details as this information becomes available. It not an NCM member, it behooves members planning to attend the Caravan/Anniversary festivities to obtain an NCM membership.

CORVETTE Trivia Did You Know?


