THE CORVETTE RAFFLE TICKET SALES ARE BACK!!



Changes have been made in the way of purchasing NCM Corvette Raffle Tickets to comply with the KY gaming rules, and VVCC members should note the following new procedures.

The Raffle Ticket purchase program is now a "mail" order system by completing and sending the attached form. You can no longer order tickets via phone or purchase them on-line as before. HOWEVER, YOU CANNOT SEND THE FORM TO NCM VIA USPS (i.e. BY US MAIL) BECAUSE OF POSTAL REGULATIONS REGARDING RAFFLES, BUT RATHER YOU MUST SEND THE FORM TO NCM VIA EITHER UPS, FEDEX, DHL, OR OTHER PRIVATE CARRIER.

Notice the attached form is specific to upcoming raffles --- this one applies to raffles on 6/20, 7/25, 8/30 and 8/31. NOTICE THE 8/30 AND 8/31 RAFFLES ARE FOR GEN 8 VETTES!

To purchase one or more raffle tickets, print the attached form and complete the form legibly including your credit card payment information. If you are not comfortable giving your credit card information, you may enclose a check made out to NCM.

Village Vettes Club Metrics By Don Chaney and George Borke


Often, we are asked how many members we have in our club. Let me see if I can break down our membership and Corvettes by Generation this way. We have 183 Families (Couples) and 52 Single members. So, this represents 418 total members with 325 of being listed as Full-Time and 94 Part-Timers. We have a total of 257 Corvettes in our club. Now let me break this down by year/generation. By generation that is:

- C7 (2014-2019) 87 (33%)
- C6 (2005-2013) 58 (23%)
- C5 (1997-2004) 58 (23%)
- C4 (1984-1996) 18 (8%)
- C3 (1968-1982) 19 (6%)
- C2 (1963-1967) 12 (5%)
- C1 (1953-1962) 5 (2%)

Now do you see why we have so many newer Corvettes at our Lake Sumter Landing Car Show? Generations C5 through C7 represent nearly 80% of our members' Corvettes.

Now when we list our Corvettes by Body Style, we have the following:

- Rag Top (Convertible (all Generations)) 138 (54%)
- Targa (1-piece lift off roof panel (C4, C5, C6, and C7)) 99 (39%)
- FRC (Fixed Roof Coupe C5 only) 9 (4 %)
- T-Top (C3 Generation) 9 (4%)
- Coupe (C2 Generation) 2 (1%)

Did you know?

Five Simple and Effective Mods to Take Your C7 to the Next Level

1. Front Splitter

There are few things that can tie in the front end of a car more than a front splitter. The C7 Z06 displays this very well. It just looks that much meaner than the standard Sting Ray.

2. XL Rock Guards

Your C7 has an aggressive, curvy body profile and as a result you'll quickly notice that those wide front tires are quite flush with the top of the side skirt extension. This means that every piece of debris will follow that body line and, over time, your paint and body panels will suffer rock chips. (GM actually has a set made of the same material as the original just has more body protection...only one screw and snaps in place.)

3. Rear Diffuser

If there was a mod that he would be willing to 100% endorse, this would be the one. Something about the aggressive profile of the C7 is missing on the rear end. Hopefully, the rear end of the car is the only thing people will ever be able to see.

4. Cold Air Intake

This is the first performance modification on the list and for good reason. This mod allows you to retain an OEM+ look and impressive induction sound that won't necessarily attract the attention of everyone in a 3-block radius. A nice intake definitely gives an engine bay a more complete look and the added response and power, while modest, are welcome.

5. Exhaust

By far the most controversial of the mods on this list, mainly due to the price point and the fact that this particular exhaust makes you lose NPP functionality, a deal breaker for many owners. While, NPP compatible exhausts do exist, the options are definitely more limited and come at a premium.
