Robert (Bob) Aisenstat grew up in Brooklyn, New York and graduated from City College of New York. Helene is from Barre, Vermont. They met in Burlington, VT, where Helene was a student nurse and Bob was her patient. Bob and Helene have been married for 48 years. Their children and grandchildren are still in St. Louis. Bob and Helene are both Family Practice Physicians and had a practice together in St. Louis for almost 30 years. They were always the "Team" doctors for their kids Baseball, Soccer and especially Ice Hockey where they travelled all over the country

and Canada as their son was the Goalie for the "Jr. Blues". They moved to The Villages in 2013, and practiced here at The Villages Health for 3 years. They both retired, and now Bob works 2 days a week doing Family Medicine and Helene also works a few days a week doing Aesthetics. She has been doing aesthetics for the last 15 years.

Prior to medical school, Bob was a Firefighter/Paramedic in Deerfield Beach, FL. He was Chief of Rescue and Helene was a Paramedic/RN for Broward County EMS. 'Flightless' Honor Flight takes 23 veterans to see war memorials in D.C.

Twenty-three veterans of various eras took part in a flightless Villages Honor Flight event on Saturday, June 29th.



Marine Sgt. Kevin St. Amant, of Weirsdale, and his dog, Sarge, presented Honor Flight Challenge Coins to the 23 veterans who participated in Saturday's flightless Honor Flight.

The veterans, who served in World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War and other periods, represented the Army, Air Force, Navy and Marine Corps. They came from The Villages, Lady Lake, Oxford, Leesburg, Ocala, Eustis and Hernando.

The event kicked off at about 9 a.m. when the veterans – two of whom were 99 years old – arrived at American Legion Post 347. After a short send-off, they boarded buses and headed to Colony Cottage Recreation Center for the once-in-a-lifetime experience. They were escorted by Lady Lake Police, the American Legion Freedom Riders, Fruitland Park Police and the Sumter County Sheriff's Office.

After unloading at the recreation center, the veterans were greeted by numerous well-wishers and the TSA Honor Guard from Orlando International Airport.

As with the flights to Washington, D.C., everyone was screened by TSA agents and then checked into their flight by Rick Freitas, of Southwest Airlines in Orlando.

Through the magic of video editing and technology, after "arriving" in Baltimore, Md., they were escorted to Arlington National Cemetery, where they witnessed the changing of the guard. The next stop was the Marine Corps War Memorial, followed by the United States Air Force Memorial and a catered lunch, which was donated by City Fire.

Each participating veteran in Saturday's flightless Honor Flight received a certificate of thanks from their attending presenter representing their branch of service.

After lunch, the veterans enjoyed some time to take photographs, then continued their day with a visit to the World War II Memorial, the Korean War Memorial, the Lincoln Memorial and the Vietnam Veterans Memorial.

Each veteran who participated in the mission received a certificate of thanks from their attending presenter representing their branch of service. And each also received a Villages Honor Flight Challenge Coin from Marine Sgt. Kevin St. Amant, of Weirsdale, who was accompanied by his dog, Sarge.

The veterans then took a simulated trip back to the Baltimore airport, where they enjoyed mail call before boarding Southwest flight 1945 to Orlando International Airport.



The Honor Flight veterans received escorts to and from the Colony Recreation Center and were honored by members of the various branches of service and the TSA Honor Guard from Orlando International Airport.

They then returned to American Legion Post 347 amid a huge fanfare, complete with an escort by Lady Lake and Fruitland Park police officers, Sumter County sheriff's deputies, more than 30 members of The Villages Nomads and 31 Corvettes from The Villages Corvette Club. "The veterans were very excited about the day and definitely surprised," said longtime Honor Flight volunteer Debbie Diroff, who served as a bus captain on the mission. "They enjoyed a resounding homecoming with a huge attendance of well-wishers. The room was filled to capacity."

Villages Honor Flight flew its first mission on May 2012. The Flightless program was launched in September 2014 to give veterans who are unable to participate in a trip to Washington, D.C. the opportunity to enjoy the experience.



A large crowd of well-wishers attended the welcome-home ceremony for 23 Honor Flight Veterans on Saturday afternoon at American Legion Post 347 in Lady Lake.

The Flightless program, through video technology and a little magic, recreates the entire experience of a normal mission except for the actual flight to Washington, D.C. and back. Each participating veteran had a dedicated guardian, a preflight meeting to get the mission participants together for an orientation and some socialization, a special flight shirt and a squad-oriented social event.

Welcome our new President & CEO - Dr. Sean Preston

The National Corvette Museum Board of Directors has selected Dr. Sean Preston to serve as President and CEO of the National Corvette Museum. Dr. Preston joins the NCM, effective July 1, from Portland, OR where he served as President of a non-profit independent school. He succeeds 23-year NCM CEO/Executive Director Wendell Strode, who announced his retirement May 2018.

"When Wendell announced his retirement, we knew it was a huge drivers' seat to fill," said NCM Board and Search Committee Chair Lon Helton. "The NCM Search Committee teamed with Chicago-based Kittleman & Associates to conduct a thorough nationwide search to find the best possible candidates – and there were many. Sean possesses the leadership skills, diverse qualities, relationships and unique skill sets necessary to collaborate with NCM Board of Directors to expand the mission and strategic objective of the NCM while being mindful of the unique legacy and spirit of the organization. His skills as an innovative leader are proven and we look forward to the NCM's next chapter with Sean leading the way for the staff, management, volunteers and members. The icing on the cake: Sean is a car guy with a 1954 Corvette and 1972 Corvette in his collection!"

Though his move to Kentucky is more than 2,300 miles from his current home, Dr. Preston is truly a southerner, having lived in Atlanta for most of his life.

"The National Corvette Museum is a one-of-a-kind organization. There are thousands of museums across the globe, but none other dedicated to Corvette," said Sean. "I'm head over heels in love with all things carrelated, and specifically Corvette. It is an honor to have been named President and CEO."

With 12-years of experience as a non-profit president, Dr. Preston is looking forward to putting his repertoire to good use. The academic nature of the Museum, and infinite possibilities with exhibits were a major factor that attracted Sean to the position. "I'm excited to look at the Museum and the exhibits from an outsider's lens and partner with the team to create new and exciting exhibits. I also think it's important that we focus on preservation of the collection. We want to expand the membership base, welcome a new generation of Corvette enthusiasts and become one of the most attended and supported car museums in the world."

Dr. Preston is a career educator, having previously served as Founding Foreign Consulting President of the American School of Zhengzhou in Zhengzhou, Henan, China; Founding President of John Crosland School in Charlotte, NC; and Executive Director of Cypress Heights Academy in Baton Rouge, LA. He has a BS in Social Science Education from the University of Georgia, a Master of Educational Leadership from Troy University, and earned his Doctorate in Educational and Non-Profit Leadership from Liberty University.

Dr. Preston will assume full CEO duties on July 1 and Strode will remain with the Museum through January 3, 2020.



Well, I found an online website where you can search to see if your Personalized License Plate is available. Before making a trip, use this service to find out if a proposed personalized plate configuration is available.

Simply go to: https://services.flhsmv.gov/ MVCheckPersonalPlate/ and put in your desired personalization. You can even submit up to 5 requests at one time.

Enter each desired personalized plate configuration. Each configurations can have a maximum of **7** characters (Example "FST_Z06" or "FASTZ06"). It is fun to just play with.
