We are thrilled to offer the Museum Delivery program to new Corvette Owners. It is an adventure like no other and a memorable addition to your new Corvette purchase. Hundreds of enthusiasts take delivery of their new Corvette at the Museum each year ... Let our team be part of your new Corvette purchase.

How It All Starts: NCM Delivery is referred to as OPTION "R8C" and is available through any Chevrolet Dealer at a cost of \$995.00. It must be specified at the time the order is finalized and a special Ship Code of "184590" must also be used to identify your Corvette for Museum Delivery.

Now Offering High Wing Spoiler, Ground Effects and Rocker Panel Extension Installs!

The Communications: The National Corvette Museum will contact the customer and offer a reasonable time frame in which the customer can choose a date for delivery. The first available date for delivery is approximately two (2) weeks from the offline date of the car. Once the car is built and its release from GM is confirmed a representative from the NCM Delivery Department will contact the customer to schedule their delivery date. The Museum will confirm the date, agreed upon by the customer, through email and will handle all further communications. If at any time the selling dealer and/or customer should have any questions regarding the delivery, they may contact the Museum at 1-800-205-4248.

The Paperwork: Customers must arrive at the NCM with the following items before a delivery can take place:

A License Plate or Temporary Tag
Proof of Ownership (Bill of sale, etc.)
Proof of Insurance
Valid Operator's License
Dealer Acknowledgement Form (download, print, fill out and return to the Museum via fax, email or mail)

The Delivery: The customer arrives at the NCM with up to three additional guests of age 10 and up, total (4) and is welcomed with signs commemorating the event. A personal, special VIP guided tour of the NCM is conducted where they will see their Corvette on display. Next, a member of the NCM Delivery Team provides a quality orientation followed by a thorough delivery presentation of their new vehicle. A unique gold decal is placed on the inside of the drivers' door jamb to signify the importance of this memorable occasion. Customers also receive a personalized interior dash plaque, personalized wall plaque and an individual photograph in front of the Museum – weather permitting. Additionally, customers have the opportunity to purchase exclusive merchandise showcasing the "R8C Museum Delivery" logo, bricks in a special commemorative section, and build sheets/window stickers if available, during the program presentation. Deliveries can also be viewed world-wide via our live webcams.

What to Wear/What to Bring: Closed toe shoes (no sandals or high heels) are a requirement for all visitors to the plant. No cameras, backpacks, purses, fanny packs, or other packages or containers may be brought into the plant except by special request (for medical reasons, etc.). Cameras are welcome at the Museum.

Post Delivery: A commemorative nameplate (with the customer's name, date of delivery and VIN) is ordered that can be applied to the wall plaque. The nameplate will then be shipped directly to the customer approximately 4-6 weeks after delivery.

Lodging: The Museum proudly recommends our business member hotels, motels, campgrounds and bed and breakfasts. Business Members Lodging.

A downpour in Spanish Springs forced Ton and Elaine Swiers, of the Village Santiago, and approximately 20 other members of the club to leave the convertible tops on and mix the flag waving as Ton and Elaine led the group around the square.

At the same time, Don and Linda Chaney, of the Village of Gilchrist, along with another 40 or so members, lucked out in Brownwood Paddock Square. Skies stayed clear long enough for Don and Linda to lead everyone in a couple of laps around the square with tops down and flags waving.

That didn't last long, though, as the rain eventually moved south.

"We were able to slow down and get the top back up," said Ann Marie Rose, of Village of Hillsborough, who participated with her husband, Richard.

After both groups cruised around all three town squares, Mother Nature made the second part of the plan a lot more pleasant.

More than 60 Corvette owners gathered for a catered picnic under the reaching limbs of the massive oaks on the grounds of the Baker House.

Don planned the evening, managing to merge multiple reasons for celebration.

First, this was the nearest Friday to celebrate June 30, 1953, when the first Corvette came off the assembly line at General Motors in Flint, Michigan...

Second, the club planned to make a donation to the nearby 150-year-old Baker which is in the midst of necessary renovations.

Third, of course, was the interest in celebrating Independence Day.

On the shady grounds, there was plenty of space for the Corvette parking and social distancing while still conversing, laughing and enjoying the catered picnic.

When considering whether he should plan a picnic in the heat of summer, Don said he knew that asking members to place lawn chairs on a recreation center parking lot without shade was not the best option. When he thought outside the box, Baker House popped into his mind.

"This worked out great," Don said as he scanned the large gathering. "It was our first club activity with food and a chance to see everybody, since the pandemic."

On behalf of the city of Wildwood, Vicki Roemer, of the Village of Mallory Square and a three-year Baker House volunteer, accepted the club's \$500 donation.

"It was a fabulous idea," Roemer said of the club's generosity. "Our funds were very low. This is very much needed for our restoration.

Originally purchased by a Chrysler Plymouth Dealer in Los Gatos, Ca and it was in the family for 40 years and never raced. It is number 18 of 18 that were produced and was sold at Barrett Jackson in 2005 and it has been in a private collection until 2019 when we acquired it. It was actually photographed on the assembly line and is in the records of The Chrysler Historical Society and also fully documented by Daryl Davis of Sanford, Fl and Galen Govier who is the ultimate authority of Chrysler Products. It was awarded Gold Stature at the Muscle Car Nationals, 2019 and was a Feature Vehicle at the Chrysler Nationals in July 2020. It may very well be the best representation of that series of 18 in existence.

"We have driven the car about 1200 miles during the time we have owned it. The real story is that Rich's very first car was this exact car, color and options except it had a 383 Golden Commando instead of the 426 and it was a four speed. So, in 60 years he's come full circle back to the first car he ever owned."

This car has so many unique features there's not room to list them all. It is, without a doubt, the best example of a 60's NHRA drag-race specific MOPAR. WHO REMEMBERS MR. NORM OUT OF CHICAGO??? A MOPAR LEGEND!!!




