Thankfully, a beautiful house and pool were included with that three-car extended space in the Village of Pine Ridge.

Although they enjoyed the golf course-view just outside the sliding doors, Chuck was experiencing some withdrawal.

After retiring, the car lover built a large garage behind their home in Lumberton, New Jersey, and filled it with automotive projects.

Their previous garage allowed space for only two cars, so the discovery of the large garage was like striking gold.

After moving in, Chuck immediately went to work, creating the man cave of his dreams.

His car show trophies finally had a forever home the moment they were placed on floating shelves. His vast collection of model cars were encased on a half wall behind perfectly polished glass.

Finishing touches on every wall included automotive memorabilia bought around the world during travels with Lynn and their granddaughter, Mallory.

"When we visited California, we tried to go to every classic car museum," Chuck said. "A lot of my posters I bought in those different museums."

"I have another four cars up north," he said. "It's an unbelievable challenge to do these restorations. Four of these cars were completely apart in boxes of parts when I got them."

"That's the year Mallory was born," Lynn said.

Villages Clubs Deliver Annual Toys for Tots Donation

Members of the Village Vettes and The Village Nomads made a large donation Wednesday.

Led by police escorts, a colorful line of corvettes and roaring motorcycles snaked its way Wednesday from Wildwood to Fruitland Park, honking horns and waving.

Santa's helpers – 30 members of the Village Vettes Corvette Club, 12 members of The Vill ge Nomads motorcycle club and two members of the Villages Camaro Club – gathered at George Nahas Chevrolet in Wildwood with cash and toys they had collected. The crowd then made its way to the Toys for Tots warehouse at the Phillips Buick GMC Collision Center in Fruitland Park for its annual donation.

The warehouse was already packed with large, labeled bags.

"Each one of these bags represents a family, and we have 900 bags in here," said Ed Lloyd, a Village of Pine Ridge

resident and Toys For Tots coordinator for Lake and Sumter counties.

But Lloyd, along with 14 other members of the Col. Phillip C. DeLong Marine Corps League Detachment 1267, made space for more donations.

When the caravan arrived, they presented this year's haul.

"We had \$11,000 more dollars show up this morning," said Village Vettes president Charlie Tagman as he handed a check to Lloyd.

Tagman, of the Village of Fenney, was visibly elated. Although cash donations were still being collected, the groups had cleared \$23,798. It was about \$3,500 more than what was raised in 2019. "Can you believe that? Even in a pandemic, we raised more money," said Jim Loguidice, a Village Vettes member and resident of the Village of Sabal Chase.

In the warehouse, Marine Corps League members unpack and stage toy donations so other volunteers can "shop" to fill children's wish lists.

In past years, staff with the Florida Department of Children and Families helped people make Christmas lists for their children. But the COVID-19 pandemic made this year a bit more difficult.

Marine Corps League volunteers had to step forward to make sure some jobs normally performed by DCF were covered.

ROAD&TRACK YOU CAN OWN THE COOLEST C7 CORVETTE IN EXISTENCE

The Pratt & Miller C7.R race car that won the Daytona 24 and Sebring 12-hour in 2015 can be yours... if you have nearly \$1 million to spend. BY BRIAN SILVESTRO

If you're a Corvette lover with some cash to spare, you're going to want to see this. One of the Pratt & Miller-built Corvette C7.R factory competition cars has come up for sale in race-ready condition for the eye-watering sum of \$950,000. It might be your only chance to own the ultimate front-engine Corvette.



This very C7.R was campaigned by Chevy throughout 2014 and 2015, taking victory at the 2015 Rolex 24 at Daytona and the 2015 Sebring 12 Hour. It's also seen action at the 24 Hours of Le Mans, and tracks such as Laguna Seca, Road America, Watkins Glen, Virginia International Raceway, and Road Atlanta. It's safe to say this car has pedigree.

While it might look like a normal C7 with some extra aero, this C7.R is dramatically different up close. The roofline is over three inches shorter, while the car is over seven inches wider. All of the panels are carbon fiber, and the interior is totally stripped out, save for a roll cage and a single bucket seat.



The engine is based on Chevy's tried-and-true LS7 V-8, debored to 5.5 liters from 7.0 to abide by race regulations. Thanks to custom internals, it's still able to make over 500 horsepower, sending torque to the rear wheels via a six-speed sequential transmission. With an unmistakably deep bellow, it was often a fan favorite at events worldwide.

Seeing as how the new C8.R has taken over factory racing duties for Chevrolet, it only makes sense the old models get sold off—though the recent sale of Pratt & Miller to the Oshkosh Corporation might also have something to do with it. Either way, this is a once-in-a-lifetime chance for a well-off Corvette collector.

Whoever ends up buying this thing: Please, get out and drive it once in a while. We absolutely love hearing it on the move.
